## **Millennium High School's Scholarship Tips:**

1. **Check this list as often as possible** at the Counseling Office, or on our Counseling Office website under the Scholarships menu.
2. **Focus on LOCAL scholarships** – there is a greater likelihood a student will win because local organizations will be looking at a smaller pool of applicants. Many more applications of this type will become available during the winter and spring. *Ms. Moore will be announcing them in senior classes!*
3. See if your **parents'/guardians' places of employment** offer any scholarships to their dependents.
4. Research **campus-based scholarships** at the college you plan to attend. Each college has a different process for applying for these. Remember that filling out the FAFSA allows colleges to consider your financial need, and in most cases is required for campus based scholarships.
5. You may also consider **web-based searches**. We prefer [www.fastweb.com](http://www.fastweb.com). Also check out [www.raise.me](http://www.raise.me) for scholarships at certain universities. Remember there are plenty of free resources – *you should NEVER have to pay to search or to apply for financial aid or scholarships.*
6. **APPLY, APPLY, APPLY!!!** There is money out there just waiting to be claimed – sometimes organizations don't give out as much money as they'd like to simply because they don't receive enough applications! If you don't apply, you will not get scholarships. Make filling out scholarship applications your part-time job!
